Children in the Service

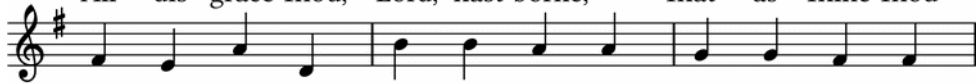

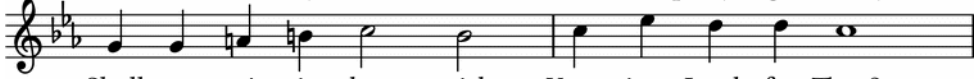

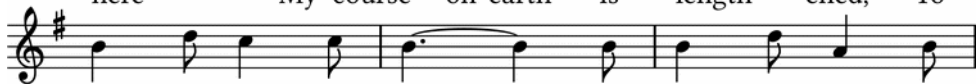
